Autumn 2 RE	<p>Wonderful Weather <i>Including: The Chronicles of Narnia: The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe (cont.), places around the world and their weather, Vivaldi's four Seasons, Welsh language for weather, Taking and reading temperature.</i></p> <p>Jesus, The Church (Community) and Festivals</p>
Spring 1 	<p>Off With Her Head! <i>Including: The life of Henry VIII, Alice in Wonderland, Tudor music and dance, Making structures, Writing stories in imaginative settings.</i></p>
Spring 2 RE	<p>Right or wrong? You decide! <i>Including: Fables, The life of people in Tudor Times including school and work, Exposition writing, Expressing likes and dislikes in Welsh, Designing and making a chair.</i></p> <p>Christian Life and Values, The Church (Prayer and Hymn Books), Easter and Jesus' Teachings</p>
Summer 1 	<p>Amazing Animals <i>Including: Charlotte's Web, Habitats, Pneumatics, The story of Sami Samon, Giraffe's Can't Dance</i></p>
Summer 2 RE	<p>Sensatinal Summer <i>Including: Charlotte's Web (Cont.), Llandudno, Heloing plants grow, Magnetism and Packaging</i></p> <p>Bible Stories and Other Faiths (Judaism)</p>
