



The School Day

Starts - 8:55am

Lunchtime at St Mary's

Pupils can bring a packed lunch from home, or school meals can be pre-ordered and paid for using the Parent Pay app.



Water and snack

Pupils can bring their own labelled water bottle to school. This can be refilled in school as necessary and returned home for washing. Pupils will also need a healthy snack for morning break time.



Medical/Illness

If your child is unwell, please contact school on the first morning of absence. If we do not receive this notification, the absence will have to be recorded as unauthorised.

Stationery

We will provide every pupil with the stationery that they need for lessons. They can bring one pencil case to school to keep these in if they wish. The pencil case will be kept in their tray overnight.

PE

Kit: White PE T-shirt, black shorts (tracksuit bottoms for cold weather). Trainers for outdoor sessions, black pumps for indoor sessions (which can be kept in school). Pupils are to come to school dressed in their kit on the day of PE, which in Blwyddyn 5 will be a Wednesday.

Homework

Reading books will be sent home on Thursdays, to be returned by the following Wednesday please. Pupils will receive homework, either on paper or assigned on our Google Classroom on Thursdays.

Here at St Mary's, we have designed a curriculum to enable our learners to develop in a way described in the four core purposes.



Our 4 purposes characters - Ambitious Aled, Enterprising Enfys, Ethical Erin and Healthy Harri.

Our curriculum is inclusive and suitable for all learners of differing ages and abilities. It is broad and balanced, encompassing a variety of topics and enquiry questions.

Whilst topics have been chosen, our curriculum will be under constant review and flexible enough to respond to things going on in our local area and wider world. We encourage 'pupil-informed planning,' engaging our pupils in activities to help them share their ideas for learning opportunities and share what they would like to learn.

Launch days

All new topics begin with a 'launch day.' This is a day off-timetetable where pupils take part in various activities, immersing them in their new topic. Activities such as meeting a character, taking part in workshops or break out challenges, going on scavenger hunts...these are just some of the activities that pupils have enjoyed so far. Engaging pupils in these ways helps to fuel their imagination and excitement for their new topic. 'Pupil Power' also takes place on launch days, allowing pupils across the whole school to make suggestions for learning activities and experience linked to the new topic. Pupils use sticky notes, large pieces of paper, Jamboard and Padlet to collaborate and share ideas. Older pupils also link their ideas to the six areas of learning and experience.



Our Topics

Here are some of the potential activities for this year.

Topic	Enquiry questions/focus
To Infinity and Beyond	What do we know about the planets in our solar system? How do we get day and night? What space exploration is happening and by whom? How can we create our own music to describe a fantasy planet?
The Victorians	What was school like in the Victorians? How were children treated? What was Christmas like in the Victorians? What was the food like?
Heroes and Villains	What makes a hero? What can we find out about Greek Gods/Goddess? What makes a myth?
Dwr	What are the names of the rivers around the world? How can we save water? What is the water cycle? How far is it around the Welsh coastal path? How can we look after our waterways?
