Lunchtime at St Mary's

Pupils can bring a packed lunch from home, or school meals can be pre-ordered and paid for using the Parent Pay app.

Medical/Illness

If your child is unwell, please contact school on the first morning of absence. If we do not receive this notification, the absence will have to be recorded as unauthorised.

Water and snack

Pupils can bring their own labelled water bottle to school. This can be refilled in school as necessary and returned home for washing. Pupils will also need a healthy snack for morning break time.



PE/ Fresh Air Friday

PE Sessions- Blue, crew neck PE T-shirt, black shorts (tracksuit bottoms for cold weather) and school jumper/cardigan. Suitable trainers are to be worn. Pupils are to come to school dressed in their kit on the day of PE which in Year 3 will be a Monday and Friday.

Fresh Air Friday - Come in old clothes which you don't mind getting muddy, with old trainers/ waterproofs to change into (if ground is wet).

Stationery

We will provide every pupil with the stationery that they need for lessons. They can bring one small pencil case to school to keep these in if they wish. The pencil case will be kept in their tray overnight.


Homework

Reading books will be sent home on Friday. Please return by the following Wednesday. Pupils may also receive homework, either on paper or assigned on our Google Classroom. This is also to be done/ returned by the following Wednesday. If not finished the book, still send in the book bag and reading record.

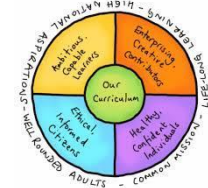

School will reply to inform you if the holiday request has been authorised and will also confirm the number of holidays your child has had so far during the academic year.

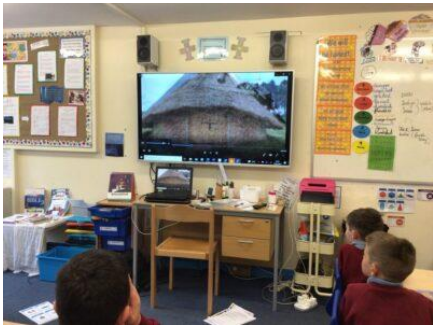
School's Essentials Grant

Launch days

All new topics begin with a 'launch day.' This is a day off-timetable where pupils take part in various activities, immersing them in their new topic. Activities such as meeting a character, taking part in workshops or break out challenges, going on scavenger hunts...these are just some of the activities that pupils have enjoyed so far. Engaging pupils in these ways helps to fuel their imagination and excitement for their new topic. 'Pupil Power' also takes place on launch days, allowing pupils across the whole school to make suggestions for learning activities and experience linked to the new topic. Pupils use sticky notes, large pieces of paper and Padlet to collaborate and share ideas. Older pupils also link their ideas to the six areas of learning and experience.



Our Topics

Topic	Enquiry questions/focus
#LivingMyBestLife	Importance of a balanced diet/ learning about food groups and where food comes from.
Fairytales	Reading and retelling popular fairytales, including with a twist. Looking at how events can be interpreted in different ways.
The Celts	Learning about roundhouses, Celtic life, Queen Boudicca and hillforts.
Local Area	Learning more our local area, in-particular Ruabon, in preparation for writing a report about the village.
Africa	Learning more about African culture, music and the daily life of the people living in Africa.
